Girl Talk Program

The Girl Talk program has been developed to bring mothers and daughters together in a nonthreatening, friendly environment to learn together about life changes, communication, family values, and decision making. We will present factual information about life changes, body changes, male and female difference, pregnancy, fetal development, parent responsibilities, AIDS and making responsible decisions. Girl Talk encourages both mother and daughter to apply the skills learned to develop an open communication system within the family.

A ccording to the Centers for Disease Control, sexual activity among teens results in three major health issues:

- Pregnancy among teenagers
- Sexually transmitted diseases
- Risk of HIV infection and HPV

Goals

- To provide factual information about sexuality.
- To explore sexual attitudes, feelings, values related to making responsible decisions about sexual situations.
- To encourage open communication within the family.
- To promote young girls' positive selfesteem and acceptance of sexuality.



Objectives

- Generate a healthy discussion within their families about sexuality, values, feelings and decision making.
- Generate a comparison between male and female reproductive systems.
- Discuss risks related to early sexual activity.
- Demonstrate the use of communication skills between family members.
- Generate a list of obligations and responsibilities of being a parent.
- Engage in activities which promote self-esteem.
